
VE DAY 1945

Things To Do At Home





Method:

Ingredients:

100g Dandelion Heads

350ml water

2 slices of lemon

500g Caster Sugar

This week we have a foraging recipe for you, Dandelion Honey! Just make sure you leave some dandelions growing as the bees like them

- 1. Pick the Dandelion heads from your garden or the woods.
- 2. Clean and rinse them with water to make sure they are clean.
- 3. Put them in a saucepan with the lemon and the water. Simmer for 10 minutes. Leave in the pan with the lid on for at least 4 hours. Overnight is good.
 - 4. Strain the liquid through a sieve, keep the liquid. Squeeze the flowers to get all of the liquid out.
 - 5. Add the sugar, simmer gently until it is dissolved and then boil for about 15 minutes until it is about 105 degrees like for jam (get an adult to do this!) and looks darker.
 - 6. Pour into sterilised jars. Allow to cool and enjoy! It is very sticky, runny and delicious!




BOOK REVIEW

We would feel so sad, Lonely and bored, With nothing to do, It was hard to cope.


It was lovely to see,








WW2 MEMORIES
